Modeling New Findings and Strategic Approach through Evidence-Base Interventions from Development Programs in Sub-Sahara Africa

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ABSTRACT

Preamble: There is a significant economic correlation between climate change, irregular migration, integration, participation, social inclusion, cohesion, conflict, insecurity, excessive warming, energy and sustainable environment to the vast population who are directly dependent on the environment for their livelihood.
